Pastor's Perch

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This past Sunday in the sermon I touched upon the question, "What was Jesus doing during the forty days between the time of his resurrection and his ascension?" This was a question posed to me by one of the members at Our Saviour. It is a question to which I never had given a lot of thought. What was Jesus doing during those forty days?

In the sermon then on Sunday, I discussed the interesting phrase in Luke 24:45, which says, "Then he (Jesus) opened their minds to understand the scriptures." And so, I mentioned that during those 40 days between the resurrection and the ascension, Jesus may have given the disciples a crash course on the Old Testament, but with a new twist, that is, in light of the "Jesus revelation."

And not only was Jesus "opening the disciples' minds to understand the scriptures," but the Gospel writers were doing so as well for their respective audiences. The Gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John—were written, in part, to take what the Old Testament has to say and re-working it to apply it to Jesus. As I mentioned in the sermon, these are called "proof texts." So, the Gospel writers were focused as well then on opening the minds of the disciples in their day.

So let me give you some examples of what this looked like, this crash course in the Old Testament, particularly from the Gospel of Matthew:

Isaiah 7:14→ Matthew 1:23 (About the child named "Emmanuel")

Micah 5:2→Matthew 2:6 (About the birthplace "Bethlehem")

Jeremiah 31:15→Matthew 2:18 (About the slaughter of the innocents)

Isaiah 40:3→ Matthew 3:3 (About preparing the way of the Lord)

Isaiah 9:1-2→Matthew 4:13-16 (About Jesus home in Capernaum)

Malachi 3:1→Matthew 11:10 (About John the Baptist)

Isaiah 42:1-3→Matthew 12:18-21 (About God's chosen servant)

Isaiah 6:9-10→Matthew 13:14-15 (About why Jesus speaks in parables)

Psalm 78:2→Matthew 13:35 (Again, about why Jesus speaks in parables)

Zechariah 9:9→Matthew 21:5 (About Palm Sunday)

Psalm 8:2→Matthew 21:16 (About the praises of the Lord)

Psalm 118:22-23 → Mathew 21:42 (About Jesus as the cornerstone)

Psalm 110:1→Matthew 22:44 (About Jesus as the Son of God)

Zechariah 13:7→Matthew 26:31 (About striking the shepherd and the sheep scattering)

Jeremiah 32:6-7 (as well as Zechariah 11:12-13) → Matthew 27:9-10 (About the field bought with 30 pieces of silver)

Psalm 22:18; Psalm 22:1 → Matthew 27:35; 27:46 (About the crucifixion of Jesus)

We see then how what was written in the Old Testament was re-interpreted to speak about Jesus. And we see then how the Old Testament, which was the Scriptures of the Jews, came to be seen as just as important for the early Christians. The early Christians co-opted the Old Testament from the Jews, almost stealing it from them. But in truth, the early Christians were Jews, so it is not that they were stealing the Scriptures as just re-purposing the Scriptures in light of Jesus. Anyway, the process of re-interpreting was quite remarkable. And it is this re-interpreting that kept Jesus busy with his disciples during the 40 days after his resurrection.
