
This week we welcome Pastor Evan Houck to lead us in worship.

Pastor's Perch:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

October brings with it Reformation Day! I know that department stores are not selling any Reformation Decorations nor are there many big Reformation parties. The parade through town is not focused on Reformation. But while the culture focuses on Halloween, the Church still does focus on reformation in October.

This year I think it is worth pondering more what Reformation means. The term comes from the Latin "reformare" meaning to shape again. So, it is re-forming something or reshaping



Today the threat is not just a theological one – which there is always a need to return to scripture and prayer to keep us focused on the gospel – but also a very practical one. We need to consider reshaping the Church today because many of our old systems no longer work. At one time, we had many people seeking

churches to attend; now we need to give people a reason to come and worship with us. At one time we worried about having enough programs for children and youth; now we need ways to connect with youth and help them grow in their faith. Once we were more concerned with having enough space for all of our church activities; now we must prayerfully consider how to be good stewards of a space which is larger than we need.

The reality is that the Church is always in need of Re-Formation, but it is hard work. It relies on us being faithful learners and interpreters of God's Word. It depends on us having enough faith to move forward trusting the promise of Immanuel (God with us). Reformation also takes the voices of those we agree with and those we disagree with to help us see the hopeful future that God has in store for us. It never means giving up the Church all together but reshaping for our reality.

Let's spend this October dreaming about what the reshaped Body of Christ looks like in our time and place.
